

- Support existing products any new issues come to you
- Stay on schedule PM's are the glue that keep everyone on track
- Product Development small segment of the yearly cycle
- **Customer Interview** online reviews, but it's best to meet real people


Bad online reviews are the biggest pain point for retailers.

Budget & Cost Analysis - it's helpful to review profit margins & EBITDA



IPD Skills Which ones apply to product management?

- User research you will probably end up teaching this to others
- Design Thinking many people do this, few can articulate it
- Lessons from Crits feedback is extremely valuable
- Translation business & design language communication is key!



Your First PM Role And how to land the job

- Emphasize keywords tailor your resume to match the job description "User centered design" vs "User focused design"
- •User research helpful but low on the priority list
- **Differentiate yourself** I have experience with Agile Software Development
- Ask good questions make a list for yourself "What would success look like in this job one year from now?"



• Demonstrate knowledge of the full product lifecycle – learn what it takes to ship








